This policy is intended to ensure consistency across the school in terms of home learning practice.

Homework should enhance learning through:

- Encouraging children to develop organisational skills and self- discipline;
- Bridging the gap between home and school to provide parents and carers with direct involvement in their learning;
- Develop children’s independent learning skills;
- Personalising learning and developing children’s self-motivation and self-confidence.

Agreed Procedure:

- Homework will be co-ordinated and monitored by the class teacher.
- Homework will be marked in line with the school marking and feedback policy.
- The quality of completed homework is monitored and reviewed at regular periods.
- Children are expected to read five times per week and which must be recorded in their reading diaries and signed by parents. Year 5 and 6 can record their own reading in their reading record.
- Years Two – Six will have homework books.
- Weekly spelling tests on spellings.
- Children who regularly fail to complete their homework or do not return it to school will be expected to complete it at break time.
- Homework must be completed in pencil or black/blue writing pen (rulers must be used where appropriate) and presented to our school’s high expectations.
- Homework will be set on a weekly basis
- In preparation for statutory assessment additional activities may be sent out to support learning and progress.
