**Dear All,**



SUBJECT	ACTIVITIES
READING	<p>Please continue to read for <b>at least</b> 20 minutes every day. Reading material can include: recipes, comics, home and/or school reading books etc. The school also has access to Oxford Owl which has online books (login details have been sent home).</p>
SPELLING  PHONICS	<p>Please practise these spellings:</p> <p>Year One: of, you, they, be, he, me, she, we, no and go.</p> <p>Year Two: door, floor, poor, because, kind, mind, behind, child, wild and climb.</p> <p>EYFS: The link below shows you how to pronounce the sounds as taught in school. You can sign up to either via this <a href="#">Facebook page</a> or <a href="#">YouTube channel</a>. The films are each available for 24 hours after the live lesson.</p> <p>Read the <a href="#">Sound Blending eBooks</a> in order.</p> <p>Read the <a href="#">Ditty sheets</a> in order. These have notes for parents. When your child can sound blend confidently, they can also practise reading the words on the <a href="#">Speedy Green Word slideshow</a> for Red Ditty level.</p> <p>You could watch the <a href="#">Sound Blending video</a> to help you support your child with sound blending.</p>
ENGLISH  COMMUNICATION/ LANGUAGE	<p>Year Two: Write a diary entry explaining what you've been doing today and how you're feeling. What have you enjoyed doing the most? Try to use some time conjunctions: first, then, next, after that, a while later, eventually etc.</p> <p>Year One: Draw a picture to show your favourite activity from a chosen day. Try to use capital letters and full stops to show where each sentence begins and ends.</p> <p>EYFS: Talk to someone about the activities you've done this week. Draw pictures of one activity per day and then try to put</p>

	<p>them in chronological order. Use words such as: first, then, next, after that and finally to describe the events.</p>
