Curriculum	Lesson 3				
History	To understand why the Roman Army was so successful in their invasions You will need:- • Roman Empire sheet (provided) Impressive Emperors Explain that the Romans invaded and conquered many countries, took slaves and made the men serve in the army. Ask your student why they think the Romans were so successful?				
	The two key factors were organisation and discipline . What does the successful invasion of all the countries belonging to the Roman Empire suggest about the leaders? About the Roman army?				
	Some leaders were hard-working people and others are remembered for their cruelty. Look back at the map of the Roman Empire and establish that the expansion of the Roman Empire was dependent on the skill of its generals and its highly efficient army Activity				
	Choose one from the following:- Julius Caesar, Augustus, Claudius, Hadrian, Nero, Constantine. You should research and analyse information about one of these Emperors / leaders and say what their main achievements were and why they think they were so successful. Be prepared to share your findings with the class!
