## Dimensions Curriculum History/Art Project

**Lesson 4: Create a Mosaic** (See Create a Mosaic Sheet in your week 6 work pack)

1. Using your mosaic plan from last week, create your mosaic using squares of different coloured paper and stick on the large A3 piece of paper.

**TIP** - It may be easier for you to stick strips of squares onto the paper you are using then cut each square out. This will ensure that your coloured squares are the same size.

## **Resources:**

You will need a variety of different coloured paper, depending on the colours you have used in your design. Using different tints and shades of the same colour can be very effective. The paper can be shiny, dull or sparkly. This can bring interest to a part of your design. You can you use old magazines etc. but ask a grown up first, before you start cutting things up!

I have included sheets of squared paper to stick on the back of your coloured paper and a large A3 sheet of paper, for you to stick your finished mosaic on. Enjoy!
